7th Professor Tai Ping-Yi Memorial Scholarship and Assistantship Regulations

- Article 1 The Department of Applied Mathematics (hereinafter referred to as "the Department") has created the 7th Professor Tai Ping-Yi Memorial Scholarships and Assistantships (hereinafter referred to as "the scholarships and assistantships") to encourage undergraduate students at the Department to pursue graduate studies in the Department, the Graduate Institute of Statistics, or Graduate Institute of Data Science and Information Computing.
- Article 2 Funding for the 7th Professor Tai Ping-Yi Memorial Scholarships and Assistantships (hereinafter referred to as "the scholarships and assistantships") is provided through donations from the class of the 7th (graduates from the Class of 1971).
- Article 3 Article 3Scholarship and assistantship applications shall be reviewed by the Academic Committee (convened by the Department chair).
- Article 4 Undergraduate students with outstanding academic performance or from low-income households who have been admitted to and enrolled in the Department's, the <u>Graduate Institute of Statistics'</u>, or <u>Graduate Institute of Data Science and Information Computing's graduate programs</u> are eligible to apply.
- Article 5 The scholarships and assistantships consist of two awards, the Outstanding Student Award and Excellent Student Award.

The Outstanding Student Award is for Department undergraduates who complete their degrees at least one semester early.

The Excellent Student Award is for Department undergraduates whose academic performance ranks in the top 50% upon graduation (students from low-income households are exempt from the ranking requirement).

Article 6 The scholarship amounts are as follows:

In principle, each recipient of the Outstanding Student Award will receive NT\$120,000.

In principle, each recipient of the Excellent Student Award will receive NT\$60,000.

The awards shall be disbursed over four semesters. For recipients graduating early, the remaining amount is disbursed upon completion of their dissertation defense.

- Article 7 Applicants shall submit the following documents to the Department office before enrollment in the graduate programs or before the start of each semester:
 - 1. An undergraduate academic transcript.
 - 2. Recommendation letters from two or more faculty members of the Department.
 - 3. An autobiography.
- Article 8 Article 8Applicants from low-income households shall submit the following additional documents to the Department office before enrollment in the graduate programs or before the start of each semester:
 - 1. Proof of low-income household status.

- 2. An undergraduate academic transcript.
- 3. Recommendation letters from two or more faculty members of the Department.
- 4. An autobiography.
- Article 9 The continuation or suspension of the scholarship is subject to the students' academic performance and achievements, as determined by the Academic Committee.
- Article 10 The scholarships and assistantships awarded are capped at NT\$120,000 per student per year. Any remaining funds for the year may be allocated by the Academic Committee to other Department of Applied Mathematics scholarships and assistantships
- Article 11 The class of the 7th alumni shall be notified after the list of winners has been determined at the meeting. The Department chair will hand out the scholarship and assistantship awards during a public ceremony, and scholarship and assistantship recipients must submit a thank-you letter or video.
- Article 12 These regulations and any amendments made hereto shall take effect upon passage by the Department Affairs Meetings and approval by the University president.
