

# National Chung Hsing University Doctoral Program in Data Science and Industrial Analytics

## Graduate Student Scholarship and Assistantship Regulations

June 10, 2020 Passed by the Program Meeting

- Article 1 The Doctoral Program in Data Science and Industrial Analytics has formulated the *Graduate Student Scholarship and Assistantship Regulations* (hereinafter referred to as “the Regulations”) in accordance with the National Chung Hsing University *Graduate Student Scholarship and Assistantship Regulations*.
- Article 2 The Doctoral Program in Data Science and Industrial Analytics scholarships and assistantships (hereinafter referred to as “the scholarships and assistantships”) shall be reviewed by the Program Meeting Committee (convened by the Program director), which shall oversee the application and allocation process for graduate student scholarships and assistantships.
- Article 3 The scholarships and assistantship are categorized as follows:
- (1) Scholarships shall be awarded to graduate students with outstanding performance.
  - (2) Assistantships shall be awarded to the following categories of graduate students:
    1. Graduate students who participate in practical course teaching as teaching assistants will receive assistantships in accordance with the University’s *Teaching Assistant System Directives*.
    2. Graduate students who assist with administrative duties (who are classified as labor-based, part-time assistants) will receive assistantships in accordance the National Chung Hsing University *Graduate Student Scholarship and Assistantship Regulations*.
- Article 4 Eligibility for graduate student scholarships and assistantships:
- (1) The Regulations are applicable to regular graduate students (in-service students, in-service program students, industry research master’s students, and students admitted under the *Regulations for Mainland Chinese Students Studying in Taiwanese Junior Colleges or Above* are excluded).
  - (2) Scholarships:

Doctoral students in their fourth year of study (or below) may apply. In principle, a maximum payment of NT\$30,000 per academic year per student may be awarded. The disbursement methods and amounts shall be determined by the Program Meeting Committee in accordance with the available budgets for the respective academic years.
  - (3) Assistantships:

Doctoral students in their fifth year of study (or below) may apply. In principle, a maximum payment of NT\$12,000 per month per student will be awarded.
  - (4) Graduate students who are on leave of absence or who have full-time employment outside of the University shall be ineligible.
- Article 5 In principle, doctoral student scholarships are awarded up to the fourth academic year.  
In principle, doctoral student assistantships are awarded up to the fifth academic year
- Article 6 f graduate students are found to be inadequate in fulfilling their assigned duties, as reported by relevant faculty members and confirmed by the Program Committee, they may be restricted from applying for and receiving scholarships and assistantships for one semester.
- Article 7 The Regulations and any amendments made hereto shall take effect upon passage by the Program Meetings and approval by the University president.
