

Course Regulations for Bachelor's Programs Offered by the Department of Applied Mathematics

- Article 1 Students of the Department may take General Physics and General Physics Laboratory courses offered by the Colleges of Science, College of Engineering, or College of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science. Credits earned from these courses may be counted as those from the Department's professional required courses or elective courses.
- Article 2 Courses taken in undergraduate continuing education programs may not be counted as elective course credits from other departments.
- Article 3 For inter-university courses, students who wish to have the course credits count toward their graduation credits must submit a report. Approval from both course instructors and the Department chair shall be required before students can apply for credit transfers.
- Article 4 When taking required courses offered by the Department for the first time, students may only enroll in the courses designated for their assigned divisions. However, this restriction does not apply to students retaking the courses, those who have previously withdrawn from the courses, or transfer students taking lower-division courses. Students with special needs may request a review by the Department chair, who will convene the competent meetings to review the cases.
- Article 5 Disputes regarding graduation credit requirements shall be discussed and resolved by the Academic Committee.
- Article 6 In cases of discrepancies between the Regulations and the University's *Academic Regulations* and *Course Regulations*, the latter shall prevail.
- Article 7 The Regulations and any amendments made hereto shall be implemented upon passage by the Department Affairs Meeting.
